- What will your students read and watch to engage with concepts and information?
- Are the course materials current? Should they be updated?

Engagement and Interaction

- How will you build relationships with the students?
- How will you cultivate relationships between the students?
- How will you interact and engage on a weekly basis?
- Consider developing a <u>communication plan</u> and calendar.
